## Project ECHO® Geriatric Clinics

- **WHO:** Providers, office support staff, or other healthcare partners
- **WHEN:** ECHO Hawai'i clinics are held once a month for 1.0 hour from 4-5 pm on the second Wednesday of each month.
- **HOW:** Log in or call into our Project ECHO® Geriatric Clinics via *Zoom*, a HIPAA-compliant cloud-based video conferencing service, using a computer, tablet, or even smartphone.
- **CASE PRESENTERS:** Any healthcare professional such as physician, nurse, social worker, dietician, care coordinator is eligible to share a case. Case presenters have the opportunity to receive a \$150 VISA gift card.
- **SHARE:** Forward the Project ECHO® Geriatric Clinic email announcement to your organization each month and encourage members to participate and share their cases.

Project ECHO® (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) is an innovative medical education and mentoring model that builds primary care capacity while improving access to specialty healthcare in rural communities. The Project ECHO® Geriatrics series provides increased PCP access to geriatric specialty educational consultations.

Project ECHO® Geriatric Clinics leverage technology to allow front-line providers to access the expertise from an entire team of geriatric specialists.

Professionals include geriatricians, other medicine specialists, pharmacists, social workers, public health nurses, psychologists, and other community resources

Health care professionals can ask questions, find solutions, and get advice to manage their most complex geriatric cases.

Each ECHO clinic consists of a brief didactic session, followed by a case presentation, review and discussion. The best part is the opportunity to present actual patient cases (de-identified) to the group and engage in peer-to-peer discussions. All participants will receive FREE CME for each session they attend.

Please note: All case submissions are required to be de-identified and transmitted in compliance with HIPAA. ECHO Hawai'i case consultations do not create or otherwise establish provider-patient relationships between any ECHO Hawaii specialists and patients whose cases are being presented in an ECHO clinic setting.

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
