## **Coreo Release Notes**

September 3, 2019

The following updates are scheduled to be deployed on September 9, 2019:

## **Updates**

- 1. 2019 Measure Baseline updated to apply 2018 performance rates: The 2019 individual PCP baselines have been updated to reflect 2018 performance rates. PCPs may see changes in their estimated measure award pay and total award pay as a result of this update. As a reminder, PCP performance baselines are set based on prior-year performance and are indicated in Coreo™ as an orange dashed line on the measure bar.
- 2. Controlling Blood Pressure and (CBP) and Diabetes Care: Users submitting supplemental data to report a blood pressure reading for the Controlling Blood Pressure and (CBP) and Diabetes Care Controlling Blood Pressure (<140/90) (CDC-BP) measures no longer need to submit an outpatient visit code or remote monitoring event code (CPT or HCPCS procedure code) with the BP reading for numerator credit. Supplemental data previously submitted for these measures without an outpatient visit or remote monitoring code will now be compliant if all other measure requirements are met.
- 3. Childhood Immunization Status (CIS) for Pneumococcal and Varicella numerator logic update:
  - a. Pneumococcal (PCV) The PCV numerator logic was updated to include 90669 if the date of service was on or before 12/31/18.
  - b. Varicella (VZV) The VZV numerator logic was updated to accept history of VZV with a date of service on or before the child's second birthday. Before this update, the numerator logic looked for a history of VZV with a date of service between the child's first and second birthday.

Patients with vaccinations that meet the updated measure logic will now be compliant.

- **4. 3/12 rule update:** The 3/12 rule was updated to show patients attributed to providers for at least three consecutive months within the 2019 measurement year. Previously, the 3/12 rule showed patients attributed to providers for at least three consecutive months during the previous measurement period (2018). This update may change performance numerators, denominators, affect estimated award pays for measures and total estimated award pays.
- 5. Diabetes Care Eye: The CDC-Eye numerator logic was updated to include eye exams by a new provider specialty type of ophthalmology-retinal (OPR) for numerator compliancy. Users may see an increase in numerator compliance due to this update.
